# Start It Up! Entrepreneurship Mr. Herrscher

#### **Course Description**

Suggested pairing with Make It Your Business! Business Planning

This ½ year course is designed to introduce students to the role that entrepreneurship and small businesses play in our economic



system. An in-depth study of the various steps involved in starting a new business and the financial, legal and government aspects critical to a successful small business will be covered. Topics include marketing, competition, communication, leadership, human resources, location and set up for a business, types of ownership and risk management. Students will be involved in a variety of activities including guest speakers, research projects and presentations, and a field trip.

Supply List: Bring to class everyday- pen or pencil, notebook (3 ring binder) and textbooks -Entrepreneurship: Ideas in Action

### Class Rules/Discipline Plan

- Arrive to class on-time and be prepared to learn
- Respect teacher and students
- Complete all assignments/projects and participate in class discussions

**Negative Consequences**: If rules are broken the following teacher interventions will take place:

- 1<sup>st</sup> intervention: Warning that behavior is unacceptable
- 2<sup>nd</sup> intervention: seat change
- 3<sup>rd</sup> intervention: teacher detention- 2:20 after school on Wednesdays
- 4<sup>th</sup> intervention: written referral sent to administrator/ call parents
- 5<sup>th</sup> intervention: consult with student's counselor

**Note: Severe disruption**: Student will immediately be accompanied out of the classroom to an alternative setting/ Principal's office

**Positive Consequences**: The following rewards will be used to reinforce positive classroom behavior.

- Acknowledge students for coming to class prepared and on time.
- Thank students for participation in class.

# **Attendance Policy**

Daily attendance is crucial for student success; every year students lose course credit because of an excessive number of absences. *Don't let it happen to you!* 

Entrepreneurship is a half-year course. The maximum number of absences allowed is 14. A level one form will be turned in to the office after 7 absences. A phone conference with a parent will take place at 10 absences.
