

First Day of School

What do Group A students do on the first day of school?

- On Tuesday, September 8, 2020, all hybrid students in Group A and all remote students in Group A will need to access Google Classroom from home if they have access to a device.
- Teachers should have invitations to all classes loaded by Tuesday morning but there may be some delays due to the schedule.
- At minimum, all remote students must log onto the district's website and log attendance via the posted Google Form.

What do Group B students do on the first day of school?

- On Tuesday, September 8, 2020, all hybrid students in Group B will come to the physical building. All remote students in Group B will be expected to look for an invitation to their teacher's Google Classroom and join virtually as required by the teacher. Throughout the day hybrid and remote students will follow their schedule.

I can't get into my Portal, what do I do?

- Please check the district website Parent Portal - FAQ on how to register or reset a password.

Scheduling - All Students

What you need to know about your specific schedule:

Please know we will continue to make changes up to the first day of school so check your schedule prior to the first day. Schedules have been released, please understand we will not be dropping courses until 4 weeks into school unless a mistake has been made. Also, teacher changes will not be accommodated. If you have a concern about your schedule, email your counselor. Do not go to the Counseling Center as we need to adhere to social distancing. Students upon entering school you are to follow your schedule and report immediately to your 1st period class.

Why did I sign up for certain electives but they are not on my schedule?

- Some electives may have filled up and you did not get them. Additionally, the following electives are not running due to COVID scheduling constraints:

I think I am in the wrong level of class!

- Due to various constraints some classes had to be condensed (all Chemistry is Honors, all Physics is Honors, Honors World 9 is all Global 9, H English 10 is all English 10).

What is the 10th period? It does not fall within the time schedule? Where do I go?

- Any course listed under 10th period is fully remote. Students who are scheduled for 10th period classes will access the teacher and work for those classes from home asynchronously (ie: Physical Education, Science Labs, Math Labs, Asynchronous Support). Teachers will reach out through Google Classroom.

What is the attendance requirement?

- Students must be in attendance a minimum of eighty-five (85%) of the total number of days that the course is in session or the student may not receive credit for the course.

How do I attend the laboratory required for my Regents classes in Science?

- Students in many science courses will not attend in-person lab classes. Classroom teachers will give instructions on how to complete labs when you see them for your synchronous days. Science labs are scheduled in period 10 to facilitate tracking of lab minutes.
- Some courses will still have Lab in their courses and students who are in session will attend on their normal rotation. That will be reflected in the schedule with a specific period.

How do I attend the labs for Geometry R & Algebra II R?

- Students enrolled in the supported lab classes for Geometry and Algebra II will not attend in person lab classes.
- Students will still be provided with support from their teacher but that availability will be scheduled with the teacher.

How do I attend Physical Education?

- All students will be enrolled in Physical Education remotely. Further determinations will be made within the first two weeks of school.
- Students will have a responsibility to participate in the Physical Education program on asynchronous (at-home) rotation days.
- For fully remote students, they will also be expected and required to participate in the physical education on asynchronous (independent) rotations days

I am a hybrid student, Why do I have a remote class? (i.e. Calculus)

- In order to maximize course offerings for all students some hybrid students were enrolled in remote classes while at LHS.
- Students will log into their teacher's Google Classroom and be expected to meet with their class in a virtual environment while in the physical building
- Space at the HS will be made available to do so. Students are encouraged to also have a pair of earbuds or headphones with them throughout the day as teachers within hybrid classrooms may also ask students to watch videos within the classroom.

Scheduling - Fully Remote Students

How do I attend my remote-only classes?

- Students enrolled in courses required for graduation that appear on their schedule must log in for live instruction on the rotation.
- Students double scheduled for a required core subject and an elective will access the elective assignments on days they are not attending a live remote class. Students will work independently on the material for their electives.

What courses are offered in the remote-only model?
