1. Assimilation granted voting rights for women
2. The 19th Amendment was written by Betty Friedan and argued that society had forced American women out of the job market and back into the home after WWII.
3. The Dawes Act provided the driving leadership in the women's suffrage movement.
4. The Feminine Mystique aimed at Americanizing the Native Americans. It proposed to break up tribes and reservations and grant land directly to Native Americans as individuals and families.
5. The Trail of Tears began the women's rights movement when Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Lucretia Mott fought to end inequalities faced by women.
6. Susan B. Anthony campaigned for family planning through birth control.
7. Elizabeth Cady Stanton gave female college athletes the right to the same financial support as male athletes.
8. Title IX Education Amendment 1972 was the process of becoming part of another culture
9. Margaret Sanger Author of Declaration of Sentiments and an intellectual leader at the Seneca Falls Convention.
